

Tribal Land Office Summer Internship Application

The Indian Land Tenure Foundation offers to grant up to \$10,000 for one (or up to \$15,000 for two) interns to work in your tribal land office in 2017. Interns should have completed their sophomore, junior or senior year of high school and have interest in working in some aspect of tribal land management. The purpose of this program is to provide real-life experiences to students in land offices. This internship should extend over an 11-week period over the summer, with students committing 400 hours over the period. During the internship, students are required to keep a brief daily log of their activities. At the end of the internship, students are required to submit a copy of their daily log and a two to five page report to the Foundation detailing their activities and what was learned.

Fill out the following application and submit to the Indian Land Tenure Foundation **on or before April 14, 2017.**

This is a competitive grant review with final decisions made on May 5, 2017. Interns may not be an immediate family member of any current land staff employees.
